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Notables:

- There were 56 members of the Class of 2017: 18 female and 38 male.
- Two students have continued their academic program in the Hopkinton School District.
- 71% are entering a four-year college or university.
- 11 % are entering a two-year college/university or vocational program.
- 2 students are participating in a GAP year/PG Year/transition program.
- 3 students are entering the military.
- 28% of students will be attending a college or university in New England.
- 24% of students will be attending a college or university in New Hampshire.
- 26% of students will be attending a college or university in the Northeast.
- 3 students will be attending a college or university in the South.
- 3 students will be attending a college or university west of the Mississippi River.
- 3 students will be attending a college or university in Canada.

Data analysis also includes the percentage of students identified with a learning disability who have been accepted into a college/university/vocational training program or are joining the military.
