Notables:

- There were 74 members of the Class of 2016: 36 female and 38 male.
- Two students have continued their academic program in the Hopkinton School District.
- 78% are entering a four-year college or university.
- 15 % are entering a two-year college/university or vocational program.
- 1 student is participating in a GAP year/transition program.
- 2 students are entering the military.
- 64% of students will be attending a college or university in New England.
- 38% of students will be attending a college or university in New Hampshire.
- 5 students will be attending a college or university west of the Mississippi River.
- 2 students will be attending a college or university in Canada.

Data analysis also includes the percentage of students identified with a learning disability who have been accepted into a college/university or vocational training program.

Data regarding continued attendance or completion of the program is getting stronger (Naviance, State Reporting).
